A Multi Generational Barn

The Henry barn was built circa 1880. Henry Henry came from the Emerald Isle of Ireland to Pennsylvania in 1822. In 1827, he and his wife Margaret moved to Indiana to cultivate the land. Henry and Margaret raised a family of nine children. In 1836, one of Henry's sons, William, purchased part of the property and added a tract of heavy timber to the parcel. He developed a farming property where he spent his entire life cultivating the fields and improving the homestead. William married Sarah Shaw. Together they raised eight children. In 1841, their son James Henry purchased a part of the land and woods. James erected the barn around 1878-1880. Three more generations of Henry's continued to live on and farm the land. The farming practices of the Henry's included producing wheat in the 1880's. By the time the 1950's-60's rolled around the Henry farm became known for cash grain crops and a general farm. The homestead is still owned by the Henry family, but the barn had served its usefulness and was in need of demolition.
